THE FOLLOWING VOTERS RESPECTIVELY PROVIDE THEIR SIGNATURE TO THIS PETITION AS A CONSTITUTIONAL RIGHT AS OUTLINED IN ARTICLE V SECTION 4. THESE RESIDENT VOTERS REQUEST THAT THE LOWER BRULE SIOUX TRIBAL COURT IMMEDIATELY TAKE ACTION TO REMOVE KEVIN WRIGHT, DESIREE LAROCHE, AND SONNY Y. ZIEGLER FROM OFFICE.

PETITION INFORMATION

The actions of Kevin Wright, Desiree Laroche, and Sonny Y. Ziegler clearly violate the Code of Ethics within the Constitution and By Laws of the Lower Brule Sioux Tribe, and the Personnel Policies and Procedures that they have been elected to uphold. Soon after being sworn into office said three council members have committed several violations that have had a very detrimental impact on many aspects involved in the overall operations of the Lower Brule Sioux Tribe as well as on the community of Lower Brule.

The actions taken by Kevin Wright, Desiree LaRoche, and Sonny Y. Ziegler are a direct example of instances where violation of the following Constitution and By Laws of the Lower Brule Sioux Tribe has occurred.

The foremost violation, occurring on December 12, 2014, is the act of malfeasance of office. Malfeasance being the performance by a public official of an act that is legally unjustified, harmful, or contrary to law. Malfeasance had occurred as a direct result of actions taken by Kevin Wright, Desiree Laroche, and Sonny Y. Ziegler as they attempted to swear in their own selected members in place of the already elected Chairman, Secretary Treasurer, and Council Member. This is easily supported by a YouTube video that can be referenced at the following web address:

Another violation refers to the Code Of Ethics, where the Public Conduct of Vice Chairman Kevin Wright is called to question after he openly asked members of the Tribe that were in attendance of a council meeting to "go outside" with him in a confrontational and aggressive manner. Literally calling on members of the Tribe in an apparent attempt to engage in physical altercations, endangering the Lower Brule Sioux Tribal members. This act is also easily supported and referenced by video.

SECTION 5. Code of Ethics for all elected or selected officials. Gross neglect and improper conduct of Article V, Vacancies and removal from office should be interpreted by the Tribal Council in accordance with these definitions.

 (b) IMPROPER CONDUCT- Determined by Tribal Council:
3. Public Conduct so as to question the integrity or endanger the Lower Brule Sioux Tribe or its members...

4. Malfeasance of Office- Including gross partially or oppression.

Definitions from Webster's Dictionary:

Malfeasance: illegal or dishonest activity especially by a public official or a corporation

Partiality: an unfair tendency to treat one person, group, or thing better than another

Oppression: a: unjust or cruel exercise of authority or power

b: something that grower especially in being an unjust or excessive exercise of power

The following memo to the Lower Brule BIA Office from Vice Chairman Wright stating that he will preside as Chairman, prior to Chairman Jandreau's passing is a clear violation of the following Constitutional procedure of Vacancies and Removal.

ARTICLE V – VACANCIES AND REMOVAL FROM OFFICE

SECTION 1. If an officer, councilman, selected or elected official shall die, resign, permanently leave the reservation, or while in office be found guilty of a felony or misdemeanor in any Indian, State, or Federal Court, the Tribal Council shall declare the position vacant and shall appoint a qualified individual to fill the unexpired term. (Amendment III, September 2, 1986)

Vice Chairman Wright's April 3rd memo to the BIA also violates the Lower Brule Sioux Tribe's By Laws Article 1 Section 1 especially when adhering to the following highlighted portion of said sections.

BY LAWS

OF THE

LOWER BRULE SIOUX TRIBE

ARTICLE I- DUTIES OF OFFICERS

SECTION 1. Chairman of the Tribal Council. The Chairman of the Tribal Council shall preside over all meetings of the Tribal Council, shall perform all duties of a Chairman, and exercise any authority delegated to him by the Tribal Council.

SECTION 2. Vice-Chairman of the Tribal Council. The Vice-Chairman of the Tribal Council shall assist the Chairman when called upon to do so and in the absence of the Chairman shall preside. When so presiding he shall have all the rights, privileges, and duties as well as the responsibilities of the Chairman.

Vice Chairman Wright, Council Members Sonny Ziegler and Desiree LaRoche's December 12, 2014 attempted removal and replacement of the elected Chairman, Secretary Treasurer and Council Member resulted in a temporary restraining order placed upon Defendants Wright, Ziegler and LaRoche by Judge B.J. Jones. Vice Chairman Wright's April 3rd memo, (a decision that clearly interferes with the rights of the other elected officials) consequently seems to be a direct violation of the aforementioned restraining order issued on December 16th. 2014. The April 3rd memo from Vice Chairman Wright to the BIA is also an action that is in violation of a second temporary restraining order issued by Judge B.J. Jones on February 13, 2014. Both Temporary Restraining Orders are attached and state the following: "... The **above-named Defendants are hereby temporarily restrained from attempting to take any actions** that interfere with the rights of the other elected officials duly elected by the tribal membership..." With regards to the fact that Vice Chairman Wright's memo and decision to preside as Chairman was determined without input or a vote from the Tribal Council, it is evident that the stipulations within the temporary restraining orders have been violated by Vice Chairman Wright. On May 6th 2015 Vice Chairman Wright and Council Members Ziegler and LaRoche presented the **attached** agenda for the Lower Brule Sioux Tribal Council meeting held May 6th 2015. This Agenda is an apparent attempt to ratify the unconstitutional decisions previously and prematurely made by Vice Chairman Wright. Examples of actions previously taken include the termination of Attorneys and Scott Jones as well as the hiring of Travis LaRoche, Robbie Her Many Horses, Emily Flute, and Sheryl Scott.

The previously listed actions taken by Wright, Ziegler and LaRoche are in direct violation of and fail to adhere to the following Personnel Management Policies & Procedures of the Lower Brule Sioux Tribe as described:

SECTION 02. THE SCOPE OF THESE POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

02.01 TRIBAL GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS- In general, all officials appointed Through an elective process shall be expected to follow the basic policies and procedures in matters relating to efficient and effective performance, but not those related to employment category (section 04), employment (Section 07), or adverse personnel action (Section 12). Conduct of tribal council members shall also be governed by the council's code of ethics, included here by reference.

SECTION 03. GENERAL POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

03.01.01 AT WILL EMPLOYMENT 03.01.02. MERIT PRINCIPAL 03.01.03. FAIR LABOR PRACTICE 03.01.04. DUE PROCESS 03.02.01. "SPOILS SYSTEM" 03.02.03. POLITICAL ACTIVITY 03.02.04. EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY

Section 03. General Policies and Procedures

These policies and procedures shall follow the standards and the regulations regarding special circumstances stated below.

03.01. Standards

03.01.01. "At Will" Employment

All tribal employment shall be considered to be at the will of proper tribal authority and shall not imply an employee's inalienable right to such employment. For instance, in cases of a reduction in funds, necessary reductions in force shall be without tribal liability.

03.01.02. Merit Principle

Employees may not be appointed or promoted to positions without meeting the qualifications stated in the description of the position class or in the formal job announcement. Incumbents in existing positions when these policies are implemented shall be required to meet stated qualifications within a reasonable period of time before adverse personnel action is taken.

All employee evaluations shall be based on job performance as measured by effectiveness and efficiency, with criteria or expectations clearly stated at the beginning of an evaluation period, not at the time of evaluation.

03.01.03. Fair Labor Practice

It shall be the tribe's policy to treat all employees fairly. Accusations of unfair labor practice shall be addressed according to the grievance procedures described below.

03.01.04. Due Process

All personnel actions, whether adverse or positive, shall follow due process as defined below and complete records of actions and their causes shall be noted in writing and maintained in the employee's permanent file kept in the tribe's personnel office.

All employees of any class, including temporary, part time or trainee workers, shall have a personnel file. All record of causes for adverse action shall be destroyed after five years.

03.02. Special Considerations

03.02.01. "Spoils System"

Tribal employees shall not be subject to the so-called "spoils system," that is, the political practice of newly elected officials of letting existing staff go without due process or cause.

03.02.03. Political Activity

The clear abuse of authority in a work situation for the purpose either of advancing one person's political campaign or of tearing down another person's reputation or harming his/her campaign shall be cause for adverse personnel action. Accusations of such abuse of authority shall be accompanied with clear evidence and reported in writing to the employee's immediate supervisor or, in the case of employees without a clear chain of command, to a seated election commission, whose members shall determine the appropriate course of action pursuant to the authorities invested in their commission.

03.02.04. Equal Employment Opportunity

Except as stated below in Section 07.01. For persons younger than 16 years of age, and in Section 07.02. with regard to Indian Preference, the tribe shall not discriminate in hiring against applicants for tribal employment or in promoting or training persons already employed on the basis of age, gender, race, color, religion, tribal affiliation, political preference, national origin or other factors not related to job performance.

SECTION 06. STAFFING 06.01. POSITION AUTHORIZATION 06.02. ENCUMBRANCE

Section 06. Staffing

It shall be the responsibility of managers, directors and supervisors to develop appropriate staffing plans to assure the effectiveness of programs under their supervision.

06.01. Position Authorization

In developing staffing plans, managers, directors and supervisors shall seek the authorization of the tribal council before submitting grant or contract requests. If the grant request or application to contract is approved as proposed, the council's sign-off on proposals shall constitute full, proper authorization of the positions included in the application. If the approved grant or contract is approved at less or more than the level proposed, a new authorization for staffing shall be approved by the council prior to the positions.

Before developing budgets with personnel compensation, each grant writer or other official doing staff planning shall seek the proper classification of new positions from the tribe's personnel director.

All budget submittals shall provide for the full payment of all positions included in the staffing plan.

Temporary or day labor jobs that are not emergency placements require prior council approval and shall be advertised.

06.02. Encumbrance

Once a program is funded, all personnel costs are fully encumbered as of the time positions are filled. An implied encumbrance shall be estimated by directors at the time a position has been cleared for posting and communicated to the finance director in writing.

ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED that the motion of the Defendants to dismiss this lawsuit for lack of subject matter jurisdiction is GRANTED insofar as the suit seeks an order enjoining the Defendants from exercising their rights as elected leaders of the Tribe and it is further

ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED that the motion to dismiss the Plaintiff for lack of standing is DENIED. The motion to dismiss for failure to follow Sioux Tribal Constitution and shall make every attempt to resolve their differences at official meetings and it is further

ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED that further hearing will be held, if necessary, after the March Tribal Council meeting or upon request of any party.

On April 7th 2014, Vice Chairman Wright verbally and in a personnel action form requested to place Travis LaRoche and Robbie Her Many Horses on the Lower Brule Sioux Tribe's Payroll, as well as asked for his salary to be increased to the Chairman's level. This request does not adhere to the Tribe's personnel Policies and Procedures. This request was made without Tribal Council Authorization or input, therefore violating the By Laws Article 1 Section 1. This request is also a violation of the previous restraining orders as it interferes with the rights of other council members.

On April 8th 2014 Vice Chairman Wright sent termination letters to Attorneys Matz, Adamski, and Ickes. This request was made without Tribal Council Authorization or input, therefore violating the By Laws Article 1 Section 1. This request is also a violation of the previous restraining orders as it interferes with the rights of other council members.

On April 13th 2014 Vice Chairman Wright attempted to terminate Scott Jones, citing the passing of the Chairman as the reason for Jones' termination. This attempted termination is in violation of the Lower Brule Sioux Tribe's personnel policies and procedures' due process, & spoils system as well as the Constitution's Code of Ethics- specifically malfeasance of office. This action is both a direct example of gross partiality and oppression.

On April 16th 2015 Vice Chairman Wright requested to hire Cheryl Scott and Emily Goodface. This request does not adhere to the Tribe's personnel Policies and Procedures. This request was made without Tribal Council Authorization or input, therefore violating the By Laws Article 1 Section 1. This request is also a violation of the previous restraining orders as it interferes with the rights of other council members.

On April 23rd, 2015 Vice Chairman Wright composed a letter to Assistant Secretary Kevin Washburn asking that all federal funds be frozen. This action violates the Constitution's By Laws Article 1 Section 1 as Wright was not delegated to do so with the authority of the Tribal Council. This action is also a violation of the Constitution's Code of Ethics as a potential loss of federal funding can easily be considered an attempt to endanger the income and prosperity of members of Lower Brule Sioux Tribe.

tribal law is reserved until the Parties are permitted to file any motions, resolutions or ordinances of the Tribe on or before February 27, 2015 that govern how the Tribe is authorized to bring suits, and it is further

ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED that the motion of the Defendants to dismiss on sovereign immunity grounds is DENIED and it is further

ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED that the above-named Defendants shall continue to be temporarily restrained from attempting to take any actions that interfere with the rights of the intervenors duly elected by the tribal membership and serving in office prior to December 12, 2014 except in accordance with the Lower Brule Sioux Tribal Constitution. Similarly, the intervenors shall not interfere with the rights of the Defendants and it is further

ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED that the Court continues to enjoin the Defendants and any other party from recognizing the actions purportedly taken at a Special Council meeting on December 12, 2014 and restrains the Defendants from taking any actions to carry out the motions passed at that meeting because they do not appear to have comported with the Lower Brule Sioux Tribe's Constitution, and it is further

ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED that the Defendants and intervenors as well as their agents and assigns are further temporarily restrained from taking any actions to hold Special or General meetings of the Council without a quorum or remove any elected official of the Tribe without complying with Article IV. Section 2 of the Tribe's By-Laws and Article V, Section 2 of the Tribe's Constitution, and it is further

ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED that all parties to this case shall conduct a Tribal Council meeting in March of 2015 in accordance with the Lower Brule Temporary Restraining Order issued December 16, 2014.

ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED that the above-named Defendants are hereby temporarily restrained from attempting to take any actions that interfere with the rights of the other elected officials duly elected by the tribal membership and serving in office prior to December 12, 2014 and it is further

ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED that the Court enjoins the Defendants and any other party from recognizing the actions purportedly taken at a Special Council meeting on December 12, 2014 and restrains the Defendants from taking any actions to carry out the motions passed at that meeting because they do not appear to have comported with the Lower Brule Sioux Tribe's Constitution, and it is further

ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED that the Defendants and their agents and assigns are further temporarily restrained from taking any actions to hold Special or General meetings of the Council without a quorum or remove any elected official of the Tribe without complying with Article IV, Section 2 of the Tribe's By-Laws and Article V, Section 2 of the Tribe's Constitution, and it is further

ORDERED, ADJUDGED, AND DECREED that hearing on whether this temporary restraining order should be extended shall be held on the 12th day of January 2015 at 8 30AM at the Lower Brule Sioux Tribal Court at which time all parties may be heard. Any responsive pleading shall be field by the Defendants at least 5 days before that hearing date.

"Any selected or elected official may be removed from office by filing with the Tribal Council of a petition setting forth specific charges as specified by a Code of Ethics against the official(s) bearing the signatures of no less than thirty percent (30%) of the qualified voters voting in the last regular tribal election. Upon receipt of such petition the Tribal Council shall, within five (5) days, notify the official(s) of the charges against him and provide no less than ten (10) days to respond to such charges in writing. The Tribal Council, no less than five (5) days after receipt of the accused official's reply to the charges shall determine whether or not to call an election on the recall petition. Should the Tribal Council decide to not call an election for the recall of an elected official, the petitioners shall file within thirty (30) days to the Lower Brule Sioux Tribal Court for review. If the official in question is a member of the judicial system, the appeal would be to the appellate court. If the official is recalled by an election, the Tribal Council shall declare the position vacant and fill in accordance with Articles 1 or 3 of this section. (Amendment III, September 2 1986)"

Said petition calls for the removal from office of Mr. Kevin Wright, Mr. Sonny Ziegler, and Ms. Desiree LaRoche and was served upon Ms. LaRoche on September 4th, 2015 at 4:37 p.m., upon Mr. Wright on September 14th, 2015 at 10:00 a.m., and upon Mr. Ziegler on September 14th, 2015 at 10:00 a.m. Any response to the petition was required to be submitted in writing to the Lower Brule Sioux Tribal Council, affording the accused an opportunity to respond in accordance with the constitutionally mandated deadline of "no less than ten (10) days..." (See above).

Upon receipt of such petition the Tribal Council shall, within five (5) days, notify the official(s) of the charges against him and provide no less than ten (10) days to respond to such charges in writing. The Tribal Council, no less than five (5) days after receipt of the accused official's reply to the charges shall determine whether or not to call an election on the recall petition. Should the Tribal Council decide to not call an election for the recall of an elected official, the petitioners shall file within thirty (30) days to the Lower Brule Sioux Tribal Court for review. If the official in question is a member of the judícial system, the appeal would be to the appellate If the official is recalled by an election, the Tribal Council court. shall declare the position vacant and fill in accordance with Articles 1 or 3 of this section. (Amendment III, September 2 1986)"
