RESOLUTION NO. 2020-127

**APPROVE - EXECUTIVE ORDER #01-2020- ESTABLISHING A ROAD
BLOCK AND CHECK POINTS TO MONITOR TRAFFIC IN AND OUT OF
THE COMMUNITY OF LOWER BRULE**

***WHEREAS**, the Lower Brule Sioux Tribe is a federally recognized Indian Tribe organized pursuant to the Indian Reorganization Act of 1934; and*

***WHEREAS**, as empowered by the Constitution and Bylaws, Article VI, Section 1, (e) the Tribal Council as authorized by law to safeguard and promote the peace, safety, morals, and general welfare of the Lower Brule Sioux Tribe and to regulate and conduct of trade and the use and disposition of property upon the reservation provided that any ordinance directly affecting nonmembers of the reservation shall be subject to review by the Secretary of the Interior; an*

WHEREAS, with great regard for the safety and wellbeing of all residents residing on the Lower Brule Reservation, the Lower Brule Sioux Tribe will establish road blocks/checkpoints on routes in and out of the Community of Lower Brule; and

WHEREAS, the Lower Brule Sioux Tribe recognizes and wants to express that unnecessary travel can endanger the lives of our residents due to the Coronavirus; and

WHEREAS, travel will be monitored and it is recommended that travelers refrain from areas of high concentration with COVID-19 such as Minnehaha (Sioux Falls) and Beadle (Huron) counties of South Dakota; and

WHEREAS, the officials manning checkpoints are hereby authorized to question travelers entering and exiting Lower Brule for information such as destination and purpose of travel; and


WHEREAS, access in and out of the community is not closed and tribal members and residents of the reservation, as well as commercial traffic, vendors and employees who do not reside but work in Lower Brule are able to deliver goods and/or travel to and from work.

These measures are a part of the Lower Brule Sioux Tribe's Mitigation Response plans and are subject to change as the situation evolves.

With consultation and consent by the Tribal Council, I, Chairman Gourneau hereby sign this Executive Order to be in effect at 8:00 Friday, May 1, 2020.

The foregoing resolution was duly adopted by the Lower Brule Sioux Tribal Council assembled in Regular Session with a quorum present on the 6th day of May 2020 by the affirmative vote of five members for, none against, none absent, and none not-voting.

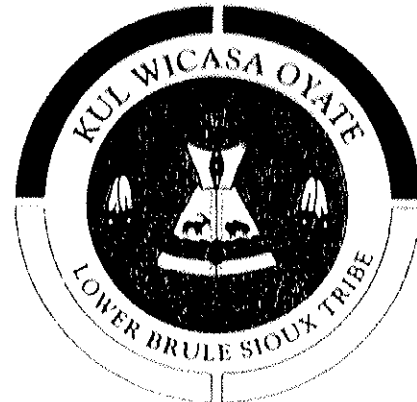


